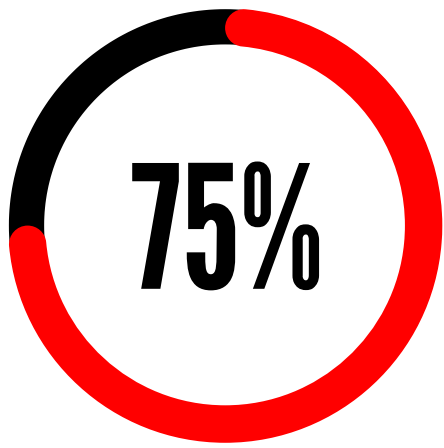


THE HIDDEN TOLL OF OPIOIDS ON AMERICA'S WORKFORCE

75% OF EMPLOYERS SAY THEIR WORKPLACE HAS BEEN DIRECTLY IMPACTED BY OPIOID USE.

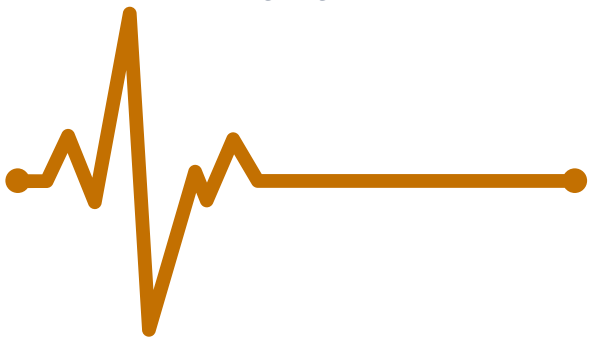
