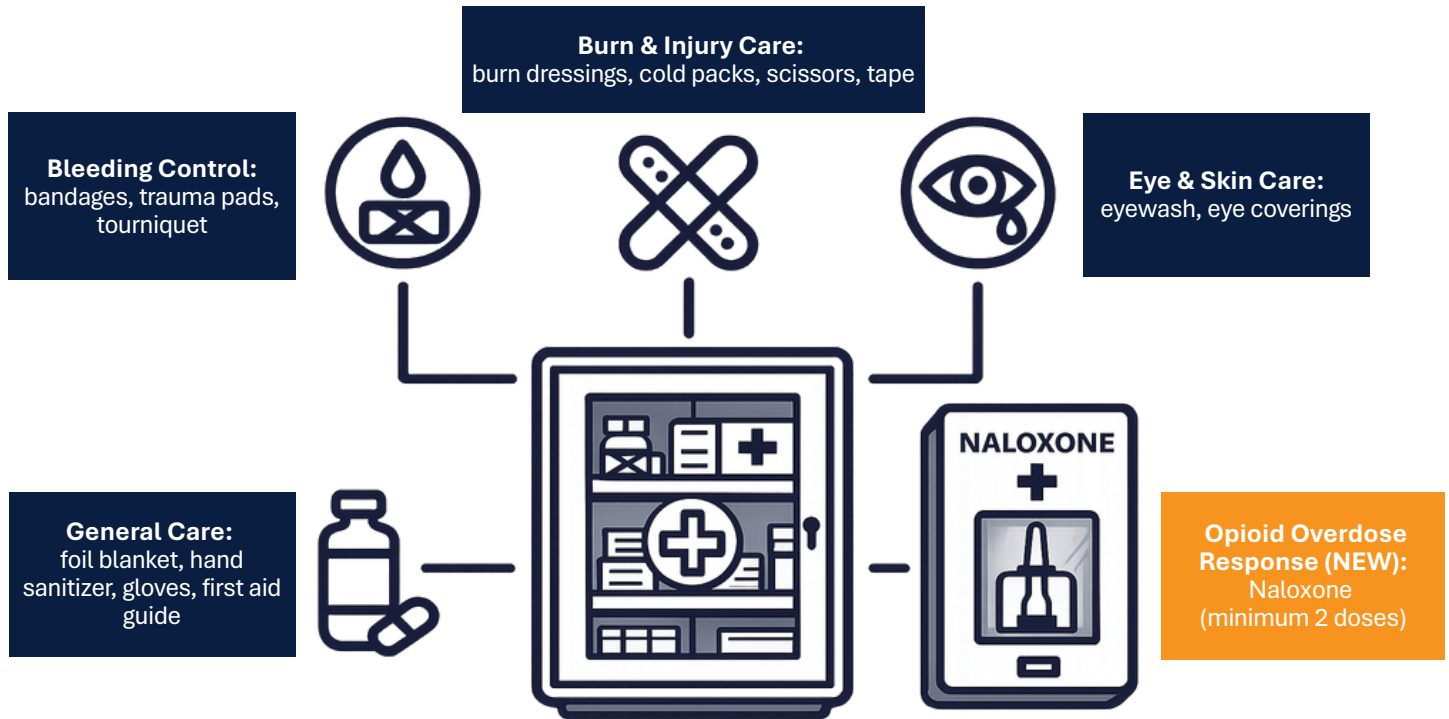




What's Inside an OSHA-Compliant First Aid Kit

ANSI/ISEA Z308.1-2026 recommends Naloxone for opioid overdose response.



Class A: Everyday, low-risk workplaces

Class B: Higher-risk sites, adds splints, more quantities, bleeding control

Containers: Type I (stationary), II (portable indoor), III (indoor/outdoor, water-resistant), IV (heavy-duty outdoor)

All kits: FDA-compliant, latex-free, labeled, First Aid Guide required

WHAT'S NEW IN 2026

- Naloxone recommended for every workplace
- Updated guidance for opioid overdose response
- Continued emphasis on bleeding control, thermal protection, infection prevention

Why Naloxone?

- Over-the-counter, FDA-approved
- Reverses opioid overdoses in minutes
- Store in plain view, near other first aid
- Safe to use even if opioids not present
